#### What is my child doing? How are they going?

#### AEDC – Australian Early Developmental Census

At the P&C meeting earlier this term, I spoke about the AEDC collection happening again this year. Details about the collection are provided below:

- From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).
- The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

- Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.
- The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.
- AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.
- Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

#### **Teachers are Learners**

Staff continue to engage in learning during staff meetings. This term, our focus is on CASW (collaborative assessment of student work) for English. Staff review how students have been engaging and performing during English learning. They then collaboratively plan for the next steps. In particular, we have been interested to see student progress with spelling and reading aligned to our daily PLD lessons (Promoting Literacy Development).

In addition, this term Miss Maile and I will be attending a Reading Master Class. We will be able to share our new learnings with staff when returning. I will also be attending a Principal Roadshow led by our Central Office. This is a valuable opportunity to hear more about departmental initiatives and share this with our Bauple staff and community.

Our eKindy students had an opportunity to work with their teacher, Cath, on Wednesday at Bauple. This face-to-face day was a valuable learning and socialisation day for our little learners. We thank parents for engaging in the pod play day.

#### <u>Tiaro Landcare Visit and Mr Mo – the Butt Breathing Turtle</u>



Mrs Brischke, from Tiaro Landcare, visited our classroom to share her knowledge and experience working with the Mary River Turtle. Students have enjoyed learning about this remarkable creature. Fun facts that we have learnt include: the Mary turtle can breathe through its butt, it can stay under water for up to 3 days, males have HUGE tails, turtles can have algae grow on its head and shell giving it a punk/mohawk appearance and that it was known as the pet shop penny turtle back in the 70s (with tens of thousands of turtles removed from the river and sold as pets). Mrs Brischke was able to answer our questions and help us learn more about the magnificent Mary River turtle.

Close the book and go to your Shelf to see all your books (including assignments). From there, you can:

- Tap Options to renew or return the book, see your notes, and more.
